- From 1 July 2022, all National Cervical Screening Program (NCSP) participants aged 25-74 years old can screen using either a self-collected sample or a clinician-collected sample.
- Self-collection helps overcome barriers to cervical cancer screening and provides a safe and culturally appropriate alternative for under-screened groups.
- Self-collection is equally as sensitive for the detection of CIN2+/AIS and HPV as a practitioner-collected CST.
- Primary care teams play a critical role in increasing cervical cancer screening participation rates.
